Enterprise Oxfordshire Skills

Celebrations commence as leading lights announced at annual apprenticeship awards

An array of the county's top apprentices, businesses, education providers and champions of apprenticeships came together on 22 May for this year's Oxfordshire Apprenticeship Awards – one of the standout annual business celebration events anywhere in the region.

The spectacular awards – now in its ninth year and organised by Enterprise Oxfordshire – saw 180 guests come together at the spectacular Long Library at Blenheim Palace to celebrate all things apprenticeships.

This year, the event saw winners announced from 12 categories, all of which it is hoped will act as a major inspiration to businesses, encouraging them to explore what an apprenticeship programme could bring to their respective companies.

The overall Oxfordshire Apprentice of the Year was chosen from the winners of the five apprentice award categories by the headline sponsor, The Hill Group. This year, the accolade went to Imani D'Amore, Apprentice Youth Support Worker at Oxfordshire County Council, who also won the Advanced Apprentice of the Year and Special Recognition Award.

Apprenticeship Levy Pledge Initiative

Enterprise Oxfordshire are excited to announce the extension of our Social Contract Programme to September 2025 – including our popular Apprenticeship Levy Pledge Initiative.

The initiative – which has seen just under £5m in pledges to date – supports apprenticeship levy-paying businesses within the county to commit their unused funds to support other Oxfordshire businesses to take on apprentices. To date, just under £4m of these funds have been optimised to facilitate new apprenticeship starts within the county.

Employers in the county with an annual pay bill of £3m+ pay 0.5% of this as an apprenticeship levy and can pledge up to 50% of their levy funds annually. Levy can be pledged to Oxfordshire based small and medium sized enterprises (SMEs and other levy paying business who have fully utilised their funds), charities and social enterprises to help fund apprenticeship training and assessment.

The programme's Oxfordshire Apprenticeship Advisors offer support and guidance, which includes helping employers to unlock their apprenticeship levy and enabling smaller organisations to access unused levy in order to start or develop their apprenticeship schemes. This support is already pre-funded so is at no cost to the employer.

Enterprise Oxfordshire are urging apprenticeship levy-paying businesses, both national and within the county to pledge their unused levy, following the extension to the scheme – and reminding those that have already pledged that it is possible to re-pledge further funds.

SMEs in the county that are interested in taking on an apprentice or using apprenticeships to upskill their existing teams or fill skills gaps are also urged to engage with the programme, as they may be eligible to receive available transferred funds.



The Social Contract programme is a £1.7million programme of activity funded by the government's Contain Outbreak Management Fund via Oxfordshire County Council and led by Enterprise Oxfordshire. Originally funded until the end of March this year, the programme sees an extension, following its success to date and the commitment to furthering the outcomes already achieved by the key initiatives in place.

Helen Brind – Head of Business and Skills at Enterprise Oxfordshire, said: "We are thrilled to announce the extension to such an important initiative – and also highlight that now is most definitely the time for businesses to engage and pledge their unused levy – before it's too late.

"The initiative averages around £1.25m going back into the Oxfordshire economy each year – which showcases how beneficial programmes such as the Social Contract are in changing individual lives but also contributing to the wider benefit of whole geographies.

"Apprenticeships are a hugely powerful tool in widening the range of skills in an organisation, bringing in new ideas, or simply upskilling your existing team and retaining that talent – to receive this funding is also a no-brainer in terms of opportunity for smaller businesses within the county.

"We'd urge all businesses who may be eligible to get in touch with our Apprenticeship Advisors today."

Enterprise Oxfordshire OxGROW

Enterprise Oxfordshire urge those struggling to find employment – or change career – to access free virtual mentoring platform, 'OxGROW'

Enterprise Oxfordshire are calling for individuals within the county struggling to find employment or looking to change career direction, to sign up to their free online virtual mentoring program, 'OxGROW', and connect with local business experts.

The news comes as the age restriction to access the service is lowered to 16, to support as many people as possible who may be struggling to find, or enter, employment in the county.

The platform – produced in collaboration with virtual platform hosts, Connectr – provides free employment advice and support to individuals aged 16 and above, connecting them with professional mentors from different sectors in Oxfordshire.

Mentors provide text-based, online mentoring tailored to individual needs, offering insights into the local job market and working environments.

Through the platform, mentees can choose multiple mentors based on needs or engage in longer-term conversations with a single mentor, access learning modules on topics like resilience, confidence building and interview skills and receive support on CV enhancement at their own pace.

There are currently 23 mentors available to assist mentees through the initiative and the certificate for completing the learning modules on the platform is recognised by the Department for Work and Pensions' Jobcentre Plus in Oxfordshire.



Enterprise Oxfordshire OxGROW

OxGROW is funded by the Social Contract programme, a £1.7million programme of activity funded by the government's Contain Outbreak Management Fund via Oxfordshire County Council and led by Enterprise Oxfordshire.

Helen Brind – Head of Business and Skills at Enterprise Oxfordshire, said: "We're so pleased to announce that we've lowered the age restriction on OxGROW to include individuals from age 16.

"It's essential we recognise the challenges of entering and finding employment at any age, as well changing the course of what that career looks like – which is why the initiative also has no upper age limit.

"Our experienced and knowledgeable business experts can offer a wealth of expertise to meet the mentees needs, prepare them for interview, work with them on CVs and job applications, and ultimately give an insight into what life might look like in that career.

"Given the change in lower age limit, we'd now also urge local education providers, parents or anyone supporting an individual of over 16, to pass on details of OxGROW – it's free career mentoring, which doesn't come around all that often."

Kathryn Jackson – a Personal Development Coach who owns her own business in Oxfordshire – is a mentor for the programme and says of her mentoring approach: "I'll be supportive, I'll share what's in my career toolbox with you and I hope that builds confidence to take the first steps towards your goals.

"Sometimes we all just need that cheerleader that supports us and nudges us to take action and that might be exactly what you find in an OxGROW mentor."



Expression of Interest to Exhibit at 2025 Aspirations Day on 13th October 2025

Oxfordshire Careers Hub is running their annual careers event for students with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). The event is now held annually in October, it is attended by the majority of the special schools in Oxfordshire, with over 200 students attending last year.

Events like this are key to supporting this group of students to become successful adults. Students with SEND are more likely than their peers to become NEET (Not in Employment, Education or Training) at Post-16 and Post-18. There has been some interesting research around the positive impact of work on people's quality of life and mortality. The statistics for adults with SEND, who are in employment, are poor - 65% of people in the UK with learning disabilities want to work, yet only 4.8% are actually employed. The Aspirations Day gives these students a better idea about the progression opportunities for them in Oxfordshire, it helps them and their support networks to make decisions around their next steps after school/college. The students attending have a range of abilities and skills, many will not obtain GCSEs, and so we are looking for a variety of organisations who can offer opportunities, information and support to them.

We still need to confirm the date and timings for the day but students will arrive from 8/8:30am and the event will finish at 2/2:30pm. Students will be around Year 10 (14-15 years old) and up but will all have different abilities. Many of the students will not receive any formal qualifications, i.e. GCSEs, so please bear this in mind. Together with the schools, we will be pulling together some information to help prepare and support exhibitors to have the most meaningful interactions with the students. We will share that, and additional logistical information, when we can.
