

Enterprise Oxfordshire Business are pleased to announce its partnership with the UK Government's Department for Business and Trade (DBT) on the new Business Growth Service, designed to make it easier for businesses across the UK, including in Oxfordshire to find and access the support they need to start, grow and succeed.

The new service addresses feedback from businesses that support has previously been difficult to navigate, by connecting support from the UK Government with the vital services also delivered through local partners.

Developed as part of the Government's plan for small businesses, the new service responds directly to SMEs, supporting and complementing the experiences of existing business advice systems.

The Business Growth Service aims to streamline access to funding, expert advice and export opportunities too, helping businesses to start, grow and better thrive in today's economy.

Delivered through a partnership model, the service looks to integrate national strategy and support with locally-led delivery via Growth Hubs, including Enterprise Oxfordshire Business.

In addition to support already provided by Enterprise Oxfordshire Business, the Business Growth Service has also introduced a new digital platform, which aims to act as a single-entry for those looking to access tailored support via a national digital route.

To support awareness of the Business Growth Service and to highlight its close relationship with Growth Hubs in England, Enterprise Oxfordshire Business has committed to a number of initiatives – this includes integrating the new service into its communications and promotional activities where possible.

Connecting Futures: How Oxfordshire Careers Hub United Employers and Educators in October

Last month, Oxfordshire Careers Hub delivered two impactful events - Aspirations Day and Reimagining Meaningful Work Experience - that brought together employers and schools / colleges from across the county to help strengthen the bridge between education and employment.

Aspirations Day: Empowering SEND Students

Held on 13th October at Leonardo Royal Hotel Oxford, Aspirations Day was a careers fair for students with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), which provided a tailored careers experience. The event welcomed over 250 students from 16 local special schools and colleges, who met with 25 exhibitors, including employers, training providers and employment support organisations, such as Yellow Submarine, Williams Jet Tenders, Oxfordshire County Council, FarmAbility Kier, Sodexo, Thames Water and Laing O'Rourke.

Exhibitors showcased inclusive career pathways and provided hands-on activities to help students explore their interests and aspirations. The event built on the Careers Hub's ongoing work to ensure that every young person has access to meaningful career guidance and opportunities.

One exhibitor said: "This is my third consecutive year attending the Aspirations Day and the enthusiasm and engagement of the young people in attendance was brilliant. It was once again a very rewarding experience, as the young people seemed extremely engaged and were very happy approaching the stand to ask questions."

Di Waine, Careers Leader at Orion Academy said: "The Aspirations Day is a great way to start the year for students in Year 10 and 11, it opens discussions about post 16 options and also opens students' eyes to the career choices out there!"

Andrew Hemming, Assistant Headteacher at Chilworth House Upper School said: "One Year 11 student didn't see the point in going as his parents and school staff keep talking to him about next steps and he still didn't know what to do. Halfway around the event, the student spoke with me and said he was glad he went as it's been fun, got lots of new information and will be looking and different types of careers now."



Reimagining Meaningful Work Experience

Modern work experience, supported by the government's Work Experience Guarantee, is a progressive, multi-faceted approach to career education for young people, moving beyond a single placement to include a variety of encounters with the world of work over their secondary education. This initiative, guided by the Equalex framework from The Careers & Enterprise Company (CEC), aims to provide every student with the equivalent of 10 days of high-quality experiences to build career readiness and make informed choices.

This equitable approach will benefit both young people as they start their career journeys and employers looking to find the next generation of employees - by facilitating a variety of experiences starting early, connecting education and young people with industry and unlocking the skills and opportunities of the future workforce.

On 21st October, Oxfordshire Careers Hub hosted Reimagining Meaningful Work Experience at The Kassam Stadium, a full-day event that brought careers professionals, education leaders and employers together to work collaboratively on shaping the future of workplace experiences for young people and co-design modern, inclusive and impactful work experience models.

Representatives from 26 employers, including Milestone Infrastructure, Grondon, Oxford University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, Thames Valley Police, AWE, Rebellion, Barrus and Oxford Playhouse, participated in discussions about how to better support schools and colleges in delivering work experience that reflects the evolving world of work. The morning focused on helping employers understand school / college needs, while the afternoon facilitated networking and planning between the employers and careers professionals and senior leaders from 22 schools / colleges. Input from Marnie Bourne, Andrew Webster and Kerry Senatore from The Careers & Enterprise Company helped guide the day.

Reimagining Meaningful Work Experience

Stacey Lynch, Early Careers, Talent & Outreach Advisor at Tokamak Energy, said: "We were inspired to improve and expand our work experience efforts and engagements with our local schools at the Reimagining Work Experience event. It was extremely useful to have the opportunity to generate ideas and knowledge share with other employers and to begin the process of co-designing our work experience programmes with schools."



Joe Dunne, PE/Geography teacher, Cover Manager and Careers & Work Experience Lead at Greyfriars Catholic School said: "It was a fantastic afternoon exploring how we can design and deliver truly meaningful work experience opportunities for young people. From learning about the Equalex framework to collaborating with employers and careers leaders, the focus was clear - ensuring every student can access experiences that prepare them for the modern world of work. I'm excited to take away new ideas to help shape impactful employer partnerships and sustainable work experience programmes for our students."

Oxfordshire Careers Hub - Opportunities for Employers

Oxfordshire Careers Hub is funded by Enterprise Oxfordshire and The Careers & Enterprise Company and supports 60 local schools and colleges - including mainstream secondary, special schools, alternative provision and further education colleges - to provide their students with a careers programme which enables them to make informed decisions about their best next step.

Businesses play a vital role in this by equipping future generations with the inspiration and skills they need for work and there are numerous ways that you can support schools and students across the county, including volunteering to support careers events and initiatives, offering experiences of the workplace and becoming an Enterprise Adviser.

Assessments are offered free to businesses, thanks to funding from the UK Government's Shared Prosperity Fund and Low Carbon Hub's renewable portfolio project surpluses.

Businesses who receive an assessment can then apply to the ESOx Green Fund for funding to help pay for the cost of measures recommended.

New Oxford Living Wage rate for 2026/27

Oxford City Council has announced that the Oxford Living Wage will increase to £14.06 per hour from April 2026. The Oxford Living Wage, set at 95% of the London Living Wage, is a voluntary minimum wage employers can opt to pay, designed to help workers meet the high cost of living and working in Oxford. In 2024/25, over 175 organisations committed to pay the Oxford Living Wage, benefiting more than 30,000 employees – the highest participation since the initiative began in 2018.

Councillor Chewe Munkonge praised the milestone and urged more employers to adopt the new rate: "As we announce the new amount for 2026/27, I encourage all our current employers, and many more organisations in the city, to commit to paying their staff at least the Oxford Living Wage and help to make Oxford a better and fairer place to live and work."

Oxfordshire - Community Catalysts

Community Catalysts support local people to create and run sustainable enterprises that offer care and help at home for older people and disabled people – as well as setting up a group or activity for local people to be involved in and enjoy.

Micro-enterprises are very small ventures (fewer than eight staff) offering a wide range of support and services, from help at home to arts and crafts, exercise classes and social clubs.

For those wishing to set up an activity in their community, for people with learning disabilities we have some start up grants available.

Community Catalysts help people offering support to get started, with advice on what they need to think about to do it right. We also help people who already run a small enterprise to do something different from what they are currently doing.

The programme covers key requirements and considerations for setting up and running a small enterprise. This includes help and support at looking at what is needed and required to “do it right”
