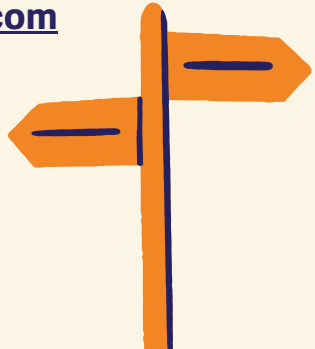

Oxfordshire's thriving business community urged to enter free prestigious county awards – as awards deadline is extended

Oxfordshire businesses are being encouraged to seek the recognition they deserve and enter the **2026 Enterprise Oxfordshire Business Marketplace and Celebration event (MAC 26)** awards, following a call for an extension to the deadline for entries.

With the deadline now extended until **Monday 10th of August**, businesses are still able to enter categories such as 'Business Leader of the Year', 'Start-Up of the Year' and 'Growth Business of the Year' ahead of the awards evening taking place on Wednesday 4th of November at Oxford Town Hall.

To take part in the Marketplace and Celebration Event – whether as an exhibitor or to be nominated for an award – businesses or individuals should have engaged with Enterprise Oxfordshire Business at any point since April 2022.

Bringing together dozens of people from Oxfordshire's business community, the event also showcases a wide range of organisations through a special marketplace arrangement, before the night's winners are announced.

Last year's event – which was also held at the city's Town Hall – brought together around 200 people from across the county, representing a range of sectors.

The event forms part of Enterprise Oxfordshire Business' commitment to the county's business community – whether organisations are starting out, growing or taking on a new challenge – by creating a platform for businesses to showcase their products and services, while also celebrating success through a series of special awards chosen by business peers.

All categories across the awards are completely free for businesses and individuals to enter.

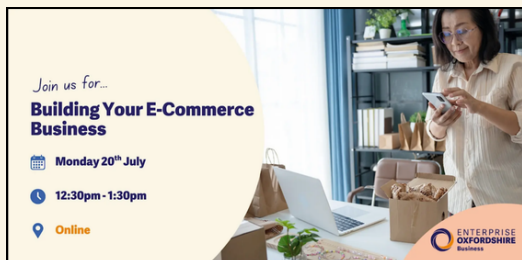

At the heart of this effort are Enterprise Advisers: experienced professionals who volunteer their time through the Oxfordshire Careers Hub to support local schools and colleges with their careers programmes. By working in partnership with Careers Leaders and senior leadership teams, they act as trusted advisers – helping shape careers programmes that are ambitious, relevant, and inclusive for all students

Connect to Work: support for individuals to get into and stay in work

Connect to Work is a free, personalised employment support programme, delivered in Oxfordshire by Enterprise Oxfordshire and Oxfordshire County Council, that helps residents who face barriers to work move into training, apprenticeships and sustainable jobs.

The programme is open to people aged 18+ living in Oxfordshire who are unemployed, economically inactive, or at risk of losing their job, particularly those with disabilities or health conditions, caring responsibilities, or other challenges that make finding work more difficult. Participants receive tailored, one-to-one support to build confidence, find suitable roles and stay in work long-term.

Nearly 300 South East manufacturers have already benefited from the Made Smarter South East programme last year. Manufacturers and makers - don't miss out!

Made Smarter is a government-funded push to drive growth in South East manufacturing SMEs, helping boost productivity and increase their competitive edge through the adoption of new industrial technologies. After last year's successes, the programme has been extended for a further year to March 31st 2027.

Once you've registered for the Made Smarter programme, you will be assigned a Technical Expert who will provide personalised advice and support to your manufacturing business. They will help you adopt advanced and automated technologies. Made Smarter also provides up to £20k in grant funding, covering up to 50%, along with specialist advice, leadership and workforce champion training, and paid internships.
