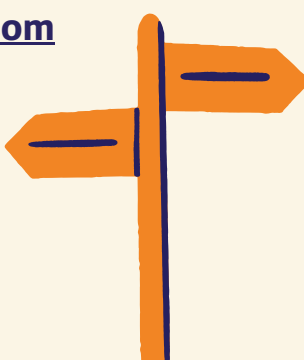

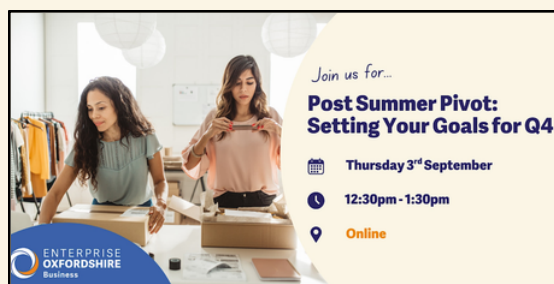

How the Growth and Skills Levy helps Oxfordshire employers open doors for young talent

With thousands of young people receiving exam results in August, now is a timely moment to look at how the Growth and Skills Levy could support your business to bring in new talent this year.



On 1st April, the government replaced the Apprenticeship Levy with the new Growth and Skills Levy, giving employers more flexibility over how levy funds are used to develop relevant, high-quality skills and support business.

Enterprise Oxfordshire connects levy-paying employers with businesses who could use the support:

Paying the levy? Large employers can pledge up to 50% of unused levy funds to another local business, fully covering the cost of apprenticeship training and end-point assessment.

Not paying the levy, or already used your own funds? Smaller employers, and even levy-payers who've exhausted their own funds, can receive a transfer and take on an apprentice or upskill existing staff at no cost.

Transferred funds can support a brand new apprentice start, an existing employee moving into a new apprenticeship, or an apprentice changing employer partway through their training.

Enterprise Oxfordshire has helped secure and redistribute levy funding right across the county, with £7m in levy funds secured and 529 apprenticeship starts fully funded.

Our team supports both donor and receiving employers at every step, from matching suitable partners to setting up the transfer on the Apprenticeship Service.

Whether you're ready to take on your first apprentice or you have unused levy funds sitting idle, results day is a great time to start the conversation.

Reverse Recruitment Fair

Alongside Oxfordshire County Council, we are also hosting a 'Reverse Recruitment Fair' at the Kassam Stadium on 29 November. This is another opportunity to engage with young people with SEND and showcase the opportunities you can offer when they leave education. Download information about the event.

A Reverse Recruitment Fair turns the usual recruitment model around. Instead of employers promoting vacancies, young people lead the conversation by sharing their skills, interests and ambitions. Employers are invited to listen, ask questions, and explore opportunities such as work experience, supported internships, apprenticeships or future employment. Taking part helps your organisation connect with local talent, strengthen inclusive recruitment practice and gain confidence in recognising and supporting the talents of young people with SEND.

Connect to Work: Supporting inclusive recruitment



Connect to Work is a voluntary employment support programme funded by the Department for Work and Pensions and delivered locally by Oxfordshire County Council in partnership with Enterprise Oxfordshire and Oxfordshire Employment. The programme helps people who face barriers to employment – including those with disabilities, long-term health conditions, caring responsibilities, experience of homelessness, care leavers, veterans, refugees and other disadvantaged groups – to find, secure and sustain meaningful work.

For employers, Connect to Work offers an opportunity to access a wider and more diverse talent pool while helping to create a more inclusive local labour market. Participants receive tailored support before and after entering employment, including help with confidence building, workplace adjustments and ongoing in-work support, helping employers recruit and retain talent successfully. It can also support existing staff.

How employers can support the programme:

- Offer employment opportunities to programme participants
- Promote Connect to Work through your business networks
- Share information with colleagues, customers and community contacts who may know eligible individuals
- Invite the Connect to Work team to employer events, careers fairs or networking activities, or contact them to find out more (CtWPartners@oxfordshire.gov.uk)

MADE SMARTER

Nearly 300 South East manufacturers have already benefited from the Made Smarter South East programme last year. Manufacturers and makers - don't miss out!

Made Smarter is a government-funded push to drive growth in South East manufacturing SMEs, helping boost productivity and increase their competitive edge through the adoption of new industrial technologies. After last year's successes, the programme has been extended for a further year to March 31st 2027.

Once you've registered for the Made Smarter programme, you will be assigned a Technical Expert who will provide personalised advice and support to your manufacturing business. They will help you adopt advanced and automated technologies. Made Smarter also provides up to £20k in grant funding, covering up to 50%, along with specialist advice, leadership and workforce champion training, and paid internships.

Pathways to Work Innovation Fund

DWP has launched a UK wide Pathways to Work Innovation Fund of up to £60m over 2 years to support new approaches that help disabled people and people with long-term health conditions move towards, enter, and stay in or progress in work. The fund is open to public, private and voluntary sector organisations, and is intended to support ambitious, creative and innovative ideas, not simply more of the same employment support. The first bidding window is expected to open in September and close in October, with decisions early in 2027 and projects starting early 2027. The second bidding round is expected in early 2027.

New Employers: What you need to know about the National Minimum Wage

Taking on your first workers is a milestone moment for any new business. It's important to pay your workers correctly from day one, as this helps build trust, demonstrates your commitment to treating workers fairly, and lays the foundations for a positive and productive working relationship.

The good news is there's plenty of guidance and support available to help you get things right. Like HMRC's free webinar for new employers on GoTo Stage – just search 'National Minimum Wage new employers' on the home page. This will tell you all you need to know, including information about; Payments & Deductions, Apprentices, what is classed as working time, salary sacrifice and Record Keeping.

National Minimum Wage (NMW) is more than just a rate, it's a calculation

A worker's hourly rate may be above the National Minimum Wage, but deductions, unpaid working time or other factors can still mean they are underpaid.

Here are some of the things to remember to make sure you get the calculation right.

NMW rates

These are the minimum hourly rates all businesses must pay workers in the UK.

New Rates The rates are updated every April, and it's your responsibility to keep up with these changes to ensure your workers receive the correct pay.

	21 and over	18 to 20	Under 18	Apprentice*
April 2026	£12.71	£10.85	£8.00	£8.00

**Apprentices are entitled to the apprentice rate if they're in the first year of their apprenticeship or under 19 during their apprenticeship. Otherwise, they get the same rate for their age as other workers.*

Not everything you pay counts towards the NMW

If a worker gets tips or shift premiums, or you refund their expenses, this is on top of their NMW pay. If you make deductions from pay for things like uniforms or training – or workers pay for these themselves – their hourly rate may fall below the NMW.

Look at the employer checklist on GOV.UK here to make sure you don't get caught out, or search 'a checklist for employers' on GOV.uk

Getting the NMW wrong isn't just an admin issue

HMRC can carry out checks at any time. If you underpay your workers, you will have to repay arrears straight away, and you may;

- have to pay a penalty
- be publicly named by the government.

It's important to keep records to show you're paying the NMW correctly

Good record keeping helps demonstrate that you're paying the National Minimum Wage correctly. It safeguards both you and your workers and can make any HMRC review much simpler. You must keep your records for 6 years.
